What To Bring List

Please consider putting your name on ALL items.

Every year we have a very large number of items left behind. If items are labeled, it is easier for us to help you retrieve them. Due to the large amount of return requests we have, campers or parents will be responsible for shipping costs. Please note that we will only hold items in Lost and Found for 30 days. After this time, they will be donated to local charities. Please be responsible for your belongings, and take an inventory, both before you leave camp and when you return home.

Study Groups

In order to better bless all of our campers, we have decided to implement some changes in the structure and content of Teens & Twenties Camp. We will continue to have Bible study sessions every day, but we will no longer require all campers to have all the research books we have required in past years. Each study group will have its own required, recommended, and optional books depending upon the level of difficulty of the subject matter and the Camper's experience and exposure to past Teens & Twenties Camp study sessions. We will be offering six different study sessions this year, and each camper must indicate first and second choices. Final study session assignments will be made by the Teens & Twenties Camp Event Committee, which will notify the camper after their registration is received so they can purchase or acquire the books they need.

Group 1: Foundations of the Faith

This group is for those campers who have a desire to develop a basic knowledge of the Bible and Spirit & Truth Fellowship International teachings, but who have not yet made it their own. This group will help you to establish your own faith and convictions and prepare you with a foundation for your Christian walk of power. You will earn a certificate of recognition upon successful completion of the studies.

Required Materials for the Foundations of the Faith Study Group:

1. NIV and KJV Bibles (You can purchase a Parallel Bible which includes both the NIV and the KJV).
2. The Bible You Can Believe It (Purchase or download for free at www.STFonline.org/store or TruthOrTradition.com/bible).
3. Becoming a Christian (Purchase or download for free at www.STFonline.org/store or TruthOrTradition.com/becoming).

Group 2: Introduction to Research

This group is for those who have basic questions about Christianity, for new Christians, or for those who are just beginning to study the Bible using reference tools. It will assume nothing about previous knowledge of the Bible or the Christian faith, and will endeavor to help campers find their own answers to their questions in God's Word. Students will learn to find their way around the Bible, get familiar with Strong's Concordance, and move on to discover exciting truths related to this year's theme. Students will be amazed at how much more confident they are about reading and understanding the Bible for themselves by the end of the week.

Required Materials for the Introduction to Research Study Group:

1. NIV and KJV Bibles (You can purchase a Parallel Bible which includes both the NIV and the KJV).
2. English Concordance: Strong's Exhaustive (If you need to buy a concordance, buy a copy of "The Strongest Strong's").

Group 3: Intermediate Research

This group will learn great truths about this year's theme and develop their skills in using biblical research materials at the same time. In general, students should have attended at least one Teens & Twenties Camp and should be somewhat familiar with Spirit & Truth Fellowship International teachings.

Required Materials for the Intermediate Study Group:

2. English Concordance: Strong's Exhaustive or Young's Analytical with Strong's numbers (Strong's recommended).

Group 4: Advanced Research

Students in this group will need to have demonstrated seriousness of purpose, ability to use Biblical reference materials, shown an understanding of the principles of biblical research and interpretation, and be fairly familiar with Spirit & Truth Fellowship International teachings. At the least, attendance at two Teens & Twenties Camps is strongly suggested.

Group 5: Contending for the Faith

This group will be for those campers who want to become more knowledgeable about how to effectively share their Christian faith in a climate that is becoming more unfriendly toward Christianity. Students will learn how to answer common criticisms of the Bible and Christianity that they will hear promoted by their teachers and professors in colleges and universities, as well as “the man on the street.”

2. English Concordance: Strong’s Exhaustive or Young’s Analytical with Strong’s numbers (Strong’s recommended).

Group 6: Service Group

The students in this group are required to have completed the minimum level of the Intermediate Research Study Group. This group is designed for those students who have the desire to explore biblical truths through applied service with a team of co-workers for Christ. This group will be involved in an actual service project on the camp grounds and will be led by an instructor who is experienced in hands-on work while applying biblical principles.

Reference Materials

General information

Bible study materials are actually a little better for the King James Version than for the NIV because the KJV is a more literal translation. You can save money when buying books by ordering by phone or online from Christian Book Distributors (1-800-Christian or www.Christianbook.com). Good used books are available on www.half.com. This is an investment you will use for years. I (John Schoenheit) am still regularly using a Greek lexicon I bought in 1971.

Please choose your books from the list below. If you are going to bring different materials, please ask John. They will probably be okay; it is just that we have had some people bring things that are too difficult for them to use, etc.

Bibles:

Bring 2 Bibles. A *New International Version* and a *King James Version*.

English Concordances:

You will use a numbering system to access the Hebrew and Greek, and the easiest and most accurate numbering system is based on the *Strong's Exhaustive Concordance*, so I recommend one of those. If you have a *Young's*, make sure it is a newer one with the Strong's numbering system in it.

You can use the *NIV Exhaustive*, or the *New American Standard Exhaustive*, etc, but you will have a harder time in your study unless your entire system uses the books based on that numbering system, which I do not recommend. The NIV Exhaustive uses the Goodrick/Kohlenberger numbering system and does have an appendix that allows you to get Strong's numbers, but it can slow down the study process. Make sure the concordance is "exhaustive" or "complete." I really recommend owning and bringing 2 Concordances—both a Strong's concordance and the concordance to the Bible you use the most.

Zondervan has just printed a larger print Strongest Strong's. It is very helpful for us whose eyesight just is not what it used to be. I bought one and love it. Quick and easy: If you do not have a Greek concordance, a Hebrew Concordance, a Greek Lexicon or a Hebrew Lexicon, I recommend The Biblical Languages Library, a four volume set from Christian Book Distributors (1-800-Christian). At about \$75, it is cheaper than ordering separately. It is based on the KJV, and is very good. You need a Strong's Concordance to make it work.

(* = John Schoenheit's preference)

Greek Concordances:

**The Englishman's Greek Concordance of the New Testament*. Based on the KJV (get one coded to the Strong's numbering system).

The Word Study Concordance. A two-volume version of the Englishman's Greek Concordance.

The Greek-English Concordance to the New Testament by J. Kohlenberger III. Based on the NIV. Uses the Goodrick/Kohlenberger numbering system. That means you have to have an NIV Exhaustive Concordance to use it.

Hebrew Concordances:

**The Englishman's Hebrew Concordance to the Old Testament*. Based on the KJV (get one coded to the Strong's numbering system).

The Hebrew-English Concordance to the Old Testament by J. Kohlenberger III. Based on the NIV. Uses the Goodrick/Kohlenberger numbering system. That means you have to have an NIV Exhaustive Concordance to use it.

Bible Dictionaries and Bible Encyclopedias:

New Bible Dictionary, Howard Marshall, ed., (Intervarsity Press).

**Holman Bible Dictionary, Trent Butler, ed., (Holman Bible Publishers).*

Smith's Dictionary of the Bible (4 volumes), H. B. Hackett, ed., (Baker Books). The one-volume version is not very good.

A Dictionary of the Bible, James Hastings, ed., (Hendrickson). Popularly known as "Hastings Bible Dictionary."

Nelson's New Illustrated Bible Dictionary, R. Youngblood, ed. (Thomas Nelson, Pub.)

**The Zondervan Pictorial Encyclopedia of the Bible*, Merrill Tenney, ed., (Regency/Zondervan. 5 volumes).

**The International Standard Bible Encyclopedia*, Geoffrey Bromiley, ed., (Eerdmans).

Bible Atlas:

Oxford Bible Atlas edited by Herbert May, now in its fourth edition.

Greek Lexicons: (Use by English Word)

Vine's Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words (There are a bunch of variations on Vine's out on the market. If you get one, get one that has the Greek words coded to Strong's numbering system; you have to have a King James Version Bible).

A Critical Lexicon and Concordance to the English and Greek New Testament by E.W. Bullinger. Commonly known as "Bullinger's Lexicon." All words are from the KJV but a full concordance allows you to find the correct Greek word. You have to have a King James Version Bible). Not coded to Strong's.

Greek Lexicons: (Use by Greek Word)

**Thayer's Greek English Lexicon of the New Testament*. Excellent and easy to use lexicon. Get one with the Strong's numbers.

**The Complete Word Study Dictionary: New Testament* by Spiros Zodhiates. Excellent lexicon, coded to Strong's.

A Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament and Other Early Christian Literature by Walter Bauer (also called "Bauer's Lexicon) edited by Arndt and Gingrich (so it is also said to be by them). There are no Strong's numbers and the words are in Greek, so you must have a fundamental knowledge of Greek to use this lexicon.

Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament Based on Semantic Domains by J. Louw and E. Nida (2 volumes). This is a wonderful resource if you can read the Greek words in Greek.

The New Analytical Greek Lexicon by W. Perschbacher. Difficult to use. Bring only if you have a rudimentary knowledge of Greek and use a Greek Interlinear. The new ones are coded to Strong's, which is helpful.

Hebrew Lexicons:

**The Brown Driver Briggs Hebrew and English Lexicon*. Make sure it is coded to the Strong's numbering system.

Theological Wordbook of the Old Testament, by Harris, Archer and Waltke. It does not cover every word in the Old Testament but it has good material on what it does cover. Bring only if you already have a **Brown Driver Briggs Hebrew and English Lexicon**.

Old Testament Word Studies by W. Wilson. Make sure you have one coded to Strong's.

Vine's Dictionary of Old Testament Words. It is based on the KJV and coded to Strong's. If you bring this, bring a KJV and a Strong's Concordance.

The Complete Word Study Dictionary Old Testament by Baker and Carpenter.

Topical Bibles:

The industry standard is *Nave's Topical Bible* and there is one based on the NIV and one on the KJV.

Synonym Studies:

Synonyms of the New Testament by Richard Trench.

Synonyms of the Old Testament by Robert Girdlestone.

Figures of Speech:

Figures of Speech Used in the Bible by E. W. Bullinger.

Customs Books:

Any you want to bring, but we have one that we have updated and reprinted, *Bible Manners & Customs* (Available online at www.STFonline.org/store).

Computer Bible Study Programs:

Any you want to bring is fine if you are bringing a laptop. We sell the one we think is the best, BibleWorks, which costs about \$349. There are less expensive ones on the market, but the investment is worth it if you plan to do in-depth study of the Greek and Hebrew. There are some great ones on the market. If you are choosing one to buy you can call John Schoenheit for advice.

Helpful Information for Ordering Study Material

1. The Biblical Languages Library from Christian Book Distributors includes a four-volume set of the Greek and Hebrew Concordances and Lexicons
2. Concordances and Lexicons must have Strong's numbering in order to work.
3. Christian Book Distributors is a good source: 1-800-Christian or www.ChristianBook.com (try www.half.com for used books).
4. You may bring a laptop with Bible Study software or any other Bible study materials from your personal library if you are in the Advanced Study Group.

Driving Directions

Coming South on Rt. 37 from Indianapolis.

Take exit 4 (Rt. 37 South) off the Indianapolis loop I-465. That will be in the southwest corner of the city, just 4 miles west of I-65 south.

It is about 40 minutes from the intersection of Rt. 37 and the I-465 beltway to Camp Vision.

Come south on Rt. 37 through Martinsville. You will turn left off Rt. 37 at mile marker 110. The mile markers are small blue rectangular signs on the passenger side of the road.

Look for an "Oliver Winery" billboard on the right about 10 minutes past Martinsville. When you see that, you have about 8 more miles.

Watch for a Poynter Sheet Metal sign on the left. When you see that, Fox Hollow Drive is approximately 1 mile further.

Look for a second "Oliver Winery" billboard on the right. When you see that, slow down immediately and get into the deceleration lane on the left.

Turn left onto Fox Hollow Road. It runs between a "Spa" business on the left and a large church with a copper roof on the right. The turn for Fox Hollow road is at mile marker 110. The mile markers are small blue rectangular signs on the passenger side of the road.

If you miss Fox Hollow and pass the Winery, go to the BP gas station a couple miles down the road on the left, turn around, and follow the directions from the South.

Fox Hollow is 2 miles long, and Camp Vision is the very last driveway on the left. It is an asphalt driveway going steeply up a hill. If you miss the driveway, after another 100 yards, Fox Hollow forms a "T" intersection with Old 37 highway. You can see the end of Fox Hollow from the driveway, so when you see the T intersection, you know you have the right uphill asphalt road. Also, at the bottom of the drive, on the right, is a long line of mailboxes.

When you turn left up the driveway, you will see the Schoenheit's red house on the right. Go straight and you will pass some A-frame cabins and then see the recreation center on the left where we will have registration.

Coming North on Rt. 37 from Bloomington.

(Coming to Camp Vision from the South on Rt. 37 from Bloomington. It is less than 20 minutes from the heart of Bloomington to Camp Vision).

In 10 minutes look for a BP gas station on your right (this is the only gas station there is from Bloomington to Camp Vision).

200 yards after the BP gas station take a right on Sample Road. Sample is a 1-mile road that makes a "T" into Old 37.

Go left onto Old 37 and go exactly ½ mile to Fox Hollow Road (the road Camp Vision is on), which only goes to the left.

Go on Fox Hollow for 100 yards and look for the steep paved drive that goes up to the right (it will be the first driveway on the right, and there will be a line of mailboxes on your left opposite the driveway).

When you turn up the driveway, you will see the Schoenheit's red house on the right. Go straight and you will pass some A-frame cabins and then see the recreation center on the left where we will have registration.

If you miss Sample Road and pass Oliver Winery, Fox Hollow Road will come up very shortly. Take it and follow the directions as if you were coming from the north.

Please be aware that all of our shuttle drivers are local ministry volunteers. Since our volunteer drivers donate their time and expenses for the campers' transportation to camp, it is important that we have your cooperation in following the guidelines we establish about travel arrangements.

Parents, we will try to have an STF representative at the airport during the hours designated above when campers are arriving. However, since there will probably be a large number of campers leaving from the camp at the same time, to depart from different airlines, your child may have a long wait at the airport for their flight, and may be on their own for most or all of that time. Airport security will not allow us to take campers to their gate.

If your travel arrival and departure times do not fit into our shuttle availability, you will need to make your own arrangements for transportation to and from the airport, at your expense. Camp Vision is approximately 45 miles and 60 minutes away from Indianapolis.

Bloomington Shuttle Service operates service from the airport to Bloomington and back, at a current cost of about \$25.00 per person, one-way. More information can be found on the website listed below. Also, note that their service operates on a set schedule (not on demand) and they do NOT travel to the camp—only to stops in Bloomington—so you would still need to make arrangements to get from Bloomington to the camp if you use their service. We have no service arrangements for transportation from their stopping points to the camp, but we can try to help as resources are available. Do not count on us providing transportation between the camp and Bloomington Shuttle unless arrangements have been made in advance.

In order to take advantage of our STF Shuttle between the airport and camp, you must arrive at the Indianapolis Airport (IND) on Sunday, July 11th between 8 AM and 4 PM and must depart on Saturday July 17th, between 8 AM and 6 PM. Indianapolis International Airport is the only airport we can serve.

Please be aware that Camp Vision is not set up to accommodate campers who arrive before July 11th, or wish to depart after July 17th. Therefore, if you are not able to meet the times for our shuttle service, you will need to make your own shuttle and housing arrangements (Indiana does not allow anyone under 21 to rent a hotel room or a car). We recommend that you have a cell phone or calling card so you can contact our shuttle service, camp cell phone, or Bloomington Shuttle Service if necessary.
